

# **CRITERIA FOR THE NORTHERN AND MIDLAND COUNTIES BEAGLE CLUB JUDGING LISTS 2022**

## **AI List**

For persons who have previously been approved by the Kennel Club to award CCs in the breed and have completed their first appointment and have the support of the Northern and Midland Counties Beagle Club

## **Eligibility to judge**

Award Challenge Certificates in the respective breed

Any Variety classes, Groups and Best in Show at Open and Limited Shows

## **A2 List (KC L4)**

For persons who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 List and have attended and passed a breed-specific assessment run by The Kennel Club

To have been accepted by The Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 list and have the support of the Northern and Midland Counties Beagle Club.

## **A3 List (KC L3)**

To have judged Beagles for a minimum of seven years and have the support of the Northern and Midland Counties Beagle Club

To have been actively exhibiting in the breed for at least ten years and to have judged at least 30 classes with a minimum of 120 dogs present (Old system). New JEP (Level 1-4) 60 dogs present and judged.

To have undergone a minimum of three mentoring sessions with a minimum of 12 months between first and third session

To have judged over a wide geographical area and been observed judging a breed club show, breed supported entry show or championship show without CCs

Have completed the remaining 10 full-day stewarding appointments (onetime qualification)

Have owned/bred a minimum of three dogs when they obtained their first entry in The Kennel Club Stud Book – save for exceptional circumstances (one-time qualification for first breed in which a judge awards CCs)

## **Eligibility to judge**

Unlimited number of classes for the respective breed at Limited, Open or Championship Shows (no CCs)

Any Variety classes and Best in Show at Limited Shows

## **B List (KC L2)**

### **First Breed**

To have been actively exhibiting in the breed for at least seven years and have the support of the Northern and Midland Counties Beagle Club

To have judged a minimum of 15 classes with a minimum of 40 dogs present and judged during a period of at least 3 years.

To have taken and passed the requirements of a dog show judge examination

To have passed the points of a dog assessment

To have attended a breed appreciation day (BAD) and pass a multiple-choice examination (MCE) for the respective breed

To have viewed the ring stewarding seminar and taken the online quiz

To have completed the critique writing seminar and taken the online quiz

### **Subsequent breeds**

To have attended a breed appreciation day (BAD) and passed a breed multiple-choice examination (MCE)

Note: This is not mandatory for a group judge for breeds in the group that they are not approved for at level 4, but attendance is strongly recommended

### **Eligibility to judge**

Unlimited number of classes for the respective breed at Limited, Open or Championship Shows (no CCs)

Any Variety classes and Best in Show at Limited Shows

## **C List (KC L1)**

To have a minimum of five years proven interest in pedigree dogs and have the support of the Northern and Midland Counties Beagle Club

To have attended a requirements of a dog show judge seminar (but not mandatory to take and pass the examination)

To have attended a conformation and movement seminar

To have completed a minimum of two full-day stewarding appointments

### **Eligibility to judge**

Up to 3 classes (4 if one is a Puppy class) or 5 (6 if one is a Puppy class) for Stud Book Band E breeds for any breed at Limited or Open Shows

**Note: Fulfilling any of the various criteria does not guarantee inclusion on any part of the Northern and Midland Counties Beagle Club judging list.**
